#### **Recommended Books for Preschool Children**

**Yoshi and the Ocean: A Sea Turtle's Incredible Journey Home** by Lindsay Moore (Greenwillow). This informative picture book follows the true story of a sea turtle's 25,000-mile swim home after years of rehabilitation in captivity. (nonfiction)

*Finding Fire* by Logan S. Kline (Candlewick). A young prehistoric boy searches for fire to

keep his family warm. Detailed illustrations and readers' imaginations help this wordless picture book come to life! (fiction)

### Daddy's Hugs and Snuggles

by Linda Ashman (Cartwheel Books). Celebrate the many ways fathers love and care for their children with this rhyming picture book. The predictable text allows young children to memorize and read along. (poetry)

**Rumble, Rumble, Dinosaur** by Katrina Charman (Bloomsbury Children's Books). Set to the tune of Twinkle, Twinkle, Little

Star, this colorful picture book follows different dinosaurs as they go about their days. A perfect read for dinosaur lovers of all ages. (fiction)

**Tap! Tap! Dance! Dance! Dance!** by Hervé Tullet (Chronicle Books). The pages in this large interactive picture book become a dance floor for readers' hands. Preschoolers will enjoy the bright illustrations while strengthening their creativity and fine motor skills. (fiction)

**Fire Chief Fran** by Linda Ashman (Astra Young Readers). Rhyming sentences and colorful collage illustrations showcase an action-packed day in the life of a fire chief. Young readers will learn about the importance of fire safety. (fiction)

**The Animal Song** by Jonty Howley (Random House). Three talented animals decide to form

a traveling band and perform for other animals in the woods. But what will happen when hibernation time sets in? There is even an accompanying website that features original music composed by the author. (fiction)



Charlie Grandy (Flamingo Books). Would your child like to learn how to talk like a bear? If so, this silly story is the perfect read-aloud picture book. It will have preschoolers cracking up! (fiction)

**Knight Owl** by Christopher Denise (Christy Ottaviano Books). This award-winning

book follows Owl and the challenges he faces while standing guard during Knight Night Watch. Find out what happens when he comes face to face with an intruder. (fiction)

How to Say Hello to a Worm: A First Guide to the Outside by Kari Percival (Penguin). Help your preschooler learn about the process of planting a garden in this engaging picture book about nature and making things grow. (nonfiction)

**Ricky, the Rock That Couldn't Roll** by Mr. Jay (New Paige Press). What happens when a group of friends get together and discover that one of them can't roll? Find out in this inspiring story about perseverance and the power of friendship. (fiction)

**Farmhouse** by Sophie Blackall (Little, Brown Books for Young Readers). This award-winning picture book follows the daily lives of a large family that once lived in an old farmhouse on a dairy farm. (fiction)

**Counting With Frida** by Patty Rodriguez and Ariana Stein (Lil' Libros). Introduce your preschooler to numbers in English and Spanish with this counting book featuring images inspired by the art of Frida

Kahlo—one of Mexico's most famous painters. (nonfiction)

**Too Early** by Nora Ericson (Harry N. Abrams). This picture book captures the precious and exhausting world of early mornings with young children. The story's soothing rhythm and calm, blue illustrations are sure to make this book a family favorite. (fiction)
